Affordable Housing Campaign Update

In January, the MIP Housing team gave a presentation to the Cheshire County Commissioners on Affordable Housing Trust Funds. The commissioners are interested in further exploring this idea as a strategy to expand access to affordable housing in our region.

MIP leaders next met with the Greater Keene & Peterborough Chamber of Commerce president and Cheshire Medical Center leaders. The business community acutely sees the need, and shares an interest in expanding access to housing.

This Spring a workgroup will be convened to develop a concrete proposal for consideration by Cheshire County. The workgroup will seek representation from housing organizations, the business community, Cheshire County staff, MIP, housing developers, and those directly impacted by lack of affordable housing.



Affordable Housing Trust Funds (AHTF) are typically established by local governments. AHTFs receive ongoing dedicated public funding to support the production and preservation of affordable housing and increase opportunities for people to access decent, affordable homes.

In a county similar to Cheshire, over 800 new affordable housing units have been created, renovated, or preserved in the last 12 years through an AHTF!

We are also aware that accessing land for affordable housing

development is a huge part of the challenge. If you know of potential land ready for development, please let us know!
