Monday, October 17, 6:30pm Keene City Hall, 2nd Floor Council Chambers



This public meeting will discuss allowing a minimum lot size of 2 acres and multifamily dwellings with limitations in the Keene Rural District. These changes are important steps to increasing housing availability. Come help MIP make the case for increased access to affordable housing.




