Father Greg Boyle Cherished Belonging: Love in Divided Times

Martin Luther King Jr. Day Event Heberton Hall, Keene Public Library Monday, January 15th, 6:00pm Free and open to all.

Fr. Greg Boyle is the founder of Homeboy Industries, the nation's largest gang intervention program, providing hope, training, and support to formerly gang-involved and previously incarcerated persons. MIP is a proud co-sponsor of this event with the Keene Human Rights Committee.

A native of Los Angeles, and a Jesuit priest, Father Greg Boyle served as pastor of Dolores Mission Church in the poorest Catholic parish in Los Angeles, which also had the highest concentration of gang activity in the city.

While there, he witnessed the devastating impact of gang violence on his community during the so-called "decade of death" that began in the late 1980s and peaked at 1,000 gang-related killings in 1992. Fr. Greg, the parish and community members adopted a radical approach to the crisis that emphasized the humanity of gang members. Their efforts led to the founding of Homeboy Industries.

Fr. Greg is the author of numerous books, including the 2010 New York Timesbestseller Tattoos on the Heart: The Power of Boundless Compassion and the 2017 Los Angeles Times-bestseller Barking to the Choir: The Power of Radical Kinship.
