This interactive ritual meal is modeled after a traditional Jewish Passover seder at which we will tell the Exodus story co-led by Rabbi Dan Aronson and Dr. Lainee Ginsberg of Congregation Ahavas Achim in Keene.

Families and people of all faiths, ages, and backgrounds are encouraged to join us as we build community around shared values of memory, renewal, justice, and freedom.

First time participating in a Seder? Not sure what a Seder is? This brief <u>video</u> provides a sense of the Passover Seder traditions and what we will do together. Our seder will substitute grape juice for wine.

The menu will include symbolic foods such as parsley to dip into salted water, bowls of charoset (a sweet paste of chopped apples, grape juice, and walnuts), hard boiled eggs, horseradish, baby carrots, grape juice (we'll drink four cups!), and, of course, matzah (unleavened bread, like a cracker). Additionally there will be vegetarian soup, matzah balls, gefilte fish on a bed of romaine lettuce, and dessert.

Currently working in Cyprus and Israel CFP provides a summer capstone residency program in five different regions across the U.S.

April 6 Laylat al-Qadr

The most venerated night of the Islamic calendar. During this night, Angel Jibril revealed the Holy Qur'an's first verses to the Prophet Muhammad.



April 9-12 Eid al-Fitr

The end of Ramadan and the Festival of Breaking the Fast. A time to visit friends and relatives, any Muslims celebrate with their families for two or three days.

April 19 - May 1 Ridvan

This Bahá'í 12-day festival commemorates the days Baha'u'llah spent on the banks of the Tigris River, during which he revealed the spiritual principles that are the foundation of the Bahá'í faith.

April 22-30 Passover

This 7-day holy week commemorates the emancipation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt. Highlighted by Seder meals and retelling the Exodus story.
